



Australian Anthroposophic Medicine Association IPMT Training July 17-24th 2007

Thank you for your interest in the International Postgraduate Medicine Training being offered in New South Wales July 17-24th 2007.

This training is designed by the Medical Section in Switzerland and the local organisation is undertaken by the Australian Anthroposophic Medicine Association. The training is given as 1 week blocks each year for 5 years, having started in 2005, so 2007 is the third block. New participants are welcomed each year, with the view that either the training will continue in Australia, or participants will take up the option to visit IPMT's in other countries.

The training was initially developed for medical practitioners, and yet the interest has been so widespread that the Australian training has been asked to include allied health practitioners in the training programme although this isn't a formal Anthroposophic training for each individual modality. Included in this group are: nurses, massage therapists, art therapists, curative eurythmists, counsellors, psychologists, occupational therapists, homeopaths, naturopaths and TCM practitioners. If you are unsure if your own particular modality is included as an "allied health profession" then please do contact us.

The training is modelled for medical practitioners to obtain an International Certificate in Anthroposophic Medicine. The training is only offered in those countries which do not already have their own medical training. Mentoring is included along with a pathway of study and case studies for the medical practitioners. For allied health practitioners, each modality will need to develop a skill specific training process, and thus initially only Certificates of Attendance are given, until further steps are negotiated with the main trainer – Dr Michaela Gloeckler.

What does the training offer for allied health professionals? It is a chance for those new to Anthroposophic medicine to be introduced to this field. It is also an opportunity for those who have already studied in their own modality, to deepen their understanding of their work by working with Dr Michaela Gloeckler, paediatrician and long term leader of the international Anthroposophic medical movement. The training includes sessions of eurythmy, nature study, text study, specialist group work and presentations on salutogenesis of organology/ethics in medicine.

The Australian IPMT is open to visitors from other countries. As the trainings are run around the world, some participants may choose to attend one block in Australia, and the next in another host country.

Fees: we have sought reasonably priced accommodation, the price given includes all accommodation and meal costs. The training is run as a not-for-profit venture, with the Medical Section covering travel costs of overseas faculty members. Faculty members offer their services free of charge to support the growth of the Medical movement around the world.
